#### ❖ Higher education – 3 Cycles of Studies:


- ➤BSc Honours (Licenciatura) (4-5 years)

- ➤ PhD (3 years)





According to 2014 statistic data, 157,431 students are enrolled in higher education in Mozambique for the degrees of Baccalaureate (Licenciatura), Masters and Doctorate.

## Higher Education in Mozambique (4)

#### Laws and decrees

- Law of higher education (Decree nº 27/2009);
- \*Higher Education Strategic Plan 2012-2020; (with six strategic areas: Quality, Expansion, Access, Research, Services and Cross Cutting Actions).
- The infrastructure issue is taken on board at a macro level through the SP for HE.
- The National Qualifications Framework of Higher Education (Decree 29/2009).



# Higher Education in Mozambique <u>Doctoral Programs</u> (5)

#### Law nº 27/2009

❖ Doctoral degree is defined as an academic qualification which is obtained in Universities at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> circle of training.

#### Law nº 29/2009

- \*3<sup>rd</sup> circle of training in higher education has got a minimum duration of three years or a minimum number correspondent of 180 academic credits
- The same Framework points out that the Doctoral degree is awarded to those that possess:
- ➤ Advanced technical specialized skills
- >Synthesis and evaluation capacity to solve critical problems in the field of research and innovation
- ➤ Abilities to redefine knowledge and professional existing practices
- Capacity of research and innovation which contributes for the development of studies in the respective field
- Higher sense of authority, innovation, autonomy, scientific and professional integrity
- Capacity of independent research, initiative, originality and critic spirit

From that total of students number in higher education level we have 0,07% of them enrolled in doctoral programs.




## Higher Education in Mozambique (8)

#### **Doctoral Programs and development - Challenges**

- From 2009 to 2014 Mozambique registered an increase of 22,3% in terms of Doctoral programs.
- Despite this improvement the country still needs a good amount of resources for the training of lectures for the 3<sup>rd</sup> circle.
- The statistics show that Doctoral students are under 1%, which is very low taking into account the developmental needs of the country.
- It is also important to note that the existing Doctoral programs are related to education, arts and humanities, social sciences and law.
- Doctoral programs in areas such as agriculture, engineering and health do still not exist and looking at the areas that the government defined as priority for development it is a great need for the country.
- Areas such as tourism, infrastructure and energy are also seen as a priority for the development of the country which therefore should be considered by higher association institutions in terms of Doctoral programs.
